GET FREE BEER SAMPLES AT CARNEGIE SCIENCE CENTER'S 21+ BEER NIGHT

SCIENCE IS BREWING AT ADULT-ONLY NIGHT FEATURING FREE SAMPLES FROM 10+ LOCAL BREWERIES



PITTSBURGH, August 16, 2018 — Get free beer samples and explore the chemistry behind this fermented concoction at Carnegie Science Center's next 21+ Science After Hours event. **21+ Beer Night** happens on **Friday, August 17** from **6–10 pm** and, aside from beer samples, features a behind-the-scenes look at the brewing process, giant beer pong, beer and cheese pairing classes, and beer-themed science demonstrations. Plus, check out a stand-up comedy show between two famous Pittsburgh comedians – Terry Jones versus Tony "T-Robe" Roberson in the Science Stage.

Additionally, free samples of beer from more than 10 local breweries will be on tap at the event. The brewers scheduled to attend include: Southern Tier Brewing Company, Penn Brewery, Block House Brewing Company, Fury Brewing Company, North Country Brewing Company, Eleventh Hour Brewing Company, The Leaning Cask Brewing Company, Helltown Brewing LLC, Couch Brewery,

4 Seasons Brewing, Rusty Gold Brewing, and Dogfish Head.

Learn about the science of beer with a presentation from expert beer guru Brooke Franus, and take Gene Ribnicky's crash course in his "Beer School" program. The Brew Museum will talk about the history of beer, and the Three Rivers Alliance of Serious Homebrewers (THRASH Homebrewers) will offer demonstrations and information about the home brewing process and experience. 21+ Night also features cash bars, snacks available for purchase in the RiverView Café, and the chance to experience four floors of hands-on exhibits including USS Requin (SS 481) Submarine – with no kids! For an extra fee, see <u>U2 3D</u> at 9:30 pm in The Rangos Giant Cinema! It's the front-row seat to one of the most popular rock bands of all times.

Proper identification is required, and all guests must show ID at the door. Tickets cost \$24 in advance online and \$29 at the door, and admission includes free beer samples and a special souvenir glass.
