



- Unleash Your Inner Maker: Get hands-on with cutting-edge technology and create something new in <u>BNY Fab Lab</u>. This exciting new digital creation space opens on the 3rd Floor of the Science Center on Sat., March 29. Don't miss out on this innovative experience!

In addition to hands-on exhibits and immersive experiences, Carnegie Science Center offers unique programming throughout the spring for visitors of all ages. Visitors can explore the science behind mental health in "Mental Health: Mind Matters," a thought-provoking exhibition designed to foster understanding and reduce stigma. The experience is included with general admission to the Science Center.

Carnegie Science Center welcomes all visitors. We work to assist visitors with disabilities in obtaining reasonable and appropriate accommodations, and in supporting equal access to services, programs, and activities. We welcome visitors in wheelchairs on the deck of our USS Requin (SS 481) submarine. Below-deck visits require full mobility. Hearing assistance devices are available for The Rangos Giant Cinema. Please ask when you buy your ticket.

Please note that requests for accommodations should be made at least two weeks prior to your visit.
